

In the meantime, enjoy this sneak peek from the shoot. Special thanks to everyone who joined in!



Governor's Budget Proposes Moving State Board of Accountancy to Department of Consumer Protection

n a scenario not unlike that suffered by actor Bill Murray in the classic movie "Groundhog Day," the Malloy administration is once again proposing to relocate the Connecticut State Board of Accountancy ("the State Board") to the Department of Consumer Protection as part of a "consolidation" move. The State Board currently resides under the office of the Secretary of the State.

Such a move would eliminate the entire staff of the State Board, a group of employees intimately familiar with the workings of Connecticut's accounting profession, including the acting chief administrative officer of the State Board, Attorney Sonia Worrell Asare. The State Board

itself, comprising practitioner and public members, would then be added to the groups served by the staff of the Department of Consumer

Protection – other state licensees such as health clubs, plumbing and piping, hypnotists, and many others.

As many will recall, four years ago the governor proposed moving the State Board, then organized independently under the Office of Policy and Management (OPM), to the Department of Consumer Protection. Fortunately for the State Board,

Such a move would eliminate the entire staff of the State Board, a group of employees intimately familiar with the workings of Connecticut's accounting profession.

Secretary of the State Denise Merrill agreed to absorb the State Board within her office, where it has functioned since.

The State Board of Accountancy generates income for the state in excess of \$2.5 million and operates on a budget of approximately \$350,000.

This proposed relocation, however, is only the beginning of a lengthy political process that will unfold during the current "long" General Assembly session that ends in June. The CTCPA will keep you apprised of any and all developments.



ast fall, when Sharon Dumais sat on a panel at her alma mater, Three Rivers Community College, the audience of approximately 40 accounting majors peppered her with their questions and stories.

How do I find a job? How do I get employers to look at a mature professional like me when my resume is up against people half my age? I don't have the best grades – will that hurt me?

"When I was in that position, I was scared!" Dumais remembered. "Is this really going to pay off? ... These are valid questions."

After her presentation, several students came up to thank her. It's that gratitude, Dumais said, that made her glad she shared her story.

"Put yourself in that frame of mind and think about what it would've meant to you back then to have someone tell you that you can do it," Dumais encouraged. "You owe it to those people – to yourself – to share your experiences."

Dumais and more than a dozen other CTCPA members and community college alumni got that chance to share their stories last fall through series of

panel discussions held at Three Rivers Community College, Manchester Community College, and Housatonic Community College.

"Enrollment numbers are up at community colleges – more and more students are using community colleges as a stepping stone on their journey," said CTCPA Student Relations Specialist **Jill Brightman**, who orchestrated the panels. "We want to encourage these people to keep going and working toward their CPA, as well as draw attention to the amazing students filling the accounting pipeline today."

The panels were so well-received that Brightman is working to arrange more presentations in the future [see sidebar at right].

Community College Student to CTCPA President John Evanich

ohn Evanich graduated from high school in the bottom 20 percent of

"I spent high school having fun," he chuckles. "And if I went away to a fouryear college, I think I would've had four more years of high school."

Instead, he got serious. While living at home and working as a bookkeeper for the firm that's now Dworken, Hillman, LaMorte & Sterczala, he enrolled in classes at Bridgeport's Housatonic Community College. He earned his associate's degree at Housatonic and, later, his bachelor's degree in accounting at the University of Bridgeport.

"The professors at Housatonic were so good and cared so much," Evanich said. "Paul DePietro was really a mentor to me and remains a friend of mine to this day."

That fun-loving, lackluster high school student would go on to become a partner with CohnReznick (Evanich retired in July of 2013), an educator with Surgent McCoy and several different colleges, and president of the Connecticut Society of CPAs.

In 2002, when Evanich became the first community college graduate to become president of the society, he knew immediately what his platform would be.

"I went to the Educational Trust Fund and said 'we're talking about wanting diversity in the profession - you're not going to get more diverse than community college students," he said. The ETF agreed and, in cooperation with Evanich, CTCPA staff and committees, local CPA firms, and community col-

lege professors, handed out the first four \$200 Outstanding Community College Accounting Student Awards in May 2003.

Since then, the ETF has awarded \$100,125 in initial scholarships to 173 deserving community college students.

Today's Outstanding Community College Accounting Student Award has evolved to a \$375 award for parttime students and \$750 for full-time students, renewable up to \$3,000 per recipient if the student meets certain criteria and upholds a certain GPA. Since 2010, the ETF has paid out an additional \$70,000 in renewable scholarships.

In 2009, Evanich achieved another first when he became the first person inducted into the Housatonic Community College Alumni Hall of Fame.



Community College Student to Professor

Ed Muenzner

A.S. in Business - Three Rivers Community College B.S. in Accounting – Eastern Connecticut State University M.S. in Accounting and Taxation – University of Hartford

n 1991, Ed Muenzner was working in a paper mill, manufacturing the coating atop Topps baseball cards, when an on-the-job injury suddenly left him without work, without health insurance - and with a wife, two small children (then aged 11/2 and 31/2), a lot of responsibility, and his personal mantra ringing in his head.

"Family first."

After he underwent back surgery, Muenzner's wife went back to work full-time as Muenzner enrolled at Three Rivers Community College and stepped into his new role as "Mr. Mom." He read accounting textbooks at the kitchen table while feeding his son in his high chair; he studied for tests lying on the floor with his daughter playing with her dolls. He started taking classes concurrently at Eastern Connecticut State University, eager to earn his accounting degree and begin taking care of his family financially again.

"Failure was not an option," he remembered. "I needed to get it done."

Muenzner earned his associate's degree and bachelor's degree in accounting in two years and four months. He graduated from Eastern in May and collected his associate's degree from Three Rivers the next month. Muenzner's sheer determination (and stellar multitasking ability!) did not go unnoticed by his schools' faculty; his Three Rivers mentor, Matt Hightower, quickly saw a new path for him accounting educator.

Twenty years later, in addition to owning his own firm in Franklin (where Hightower's son now works!), Muenzner is an associate professor at that same community college that gave him his start. He serves as the cur-

riculum coordinator for the accounting program and recently co-championed the business school's reaccreditation. In 2013, he was one of three professors to take home an inaugural "Eddy" - the CTCPA Accounting Educators of Excellence award.

The student who nominated him for the Eddys award raved about the enthusiasm and passion he has for the subject, that he's always staying late after class to answer questions and delve deeper into topics ... but the nominator appreciated Muenzner for much more than classroom lectures.

"He made the time to build a lasting friendship and his belief in me inspires

me to go beyond my classwork and take the initiative in developing the professional and interpersonal skills essential to my success in the field," the student wrote. "Because of Ed I have discovered what I want to do with my life, and I treasure his ongoing support and guidance as he mentors me through my journey."

Just like Hightower and other professors did for Muenzner.

"I never forget where I came from," Muenzner stated simply. "This is a great profession. It's done so much for me, it's done so much for my family it's my job to pay it forward."

In Memoriam: Edward Taddei, CPA

When you work for a professional membership association for 30-plus years, you get to know a great many of its members.

I first met Ed Taddei in the early 1980s. he a member of the "Relations with Bankers and Other Credit Grantors Committee," known today as the Financial Institutions Committee, and me the newly appointed staff liaison to that group. At that time, Ed was in his early sixties and I was in my midtwenties, just getting my sea legs in the world of association management.

Ed immediately sensed that this was a new role for me, so, as a senior member of the committee, he took me under his wing, but in a manner that made me feel as though I had held the position for years. That was one of Ed's many "people" talents - he could provide counsel in a manner that invisibly instilled self-confidence and enthusiasm in the beneficiary of his guidance.

Ed proved a thoughtful man in more than one sense of the word. When he spoke, no one held any doubt that he had weighed all options and possibilities, had drawn upon his considerable experience and resultant wisdom, projected all possible outcomes, and now stood ready to opine. Ed spoke when he was ready to speak, and when he did, it reminded me of the old E. F. Hutton television commercials where

an entire stadium would ignore the game at hand and cock an ear to catch E. F. Hutton's advice.

Ed never sought the limelight. He never sat at the head of the table. He spoke loudly enough to be clearly understood - never louder. In fact, I never heard him raise his voice, ever. He didn't need to.

Unless someone other than Ed told you, you would never had known that he started Connecticut's first television station (and others), mastered the real estate world, and served as an ordained deacon in the Catholic church.

And I never, ever saw Ed lose his cool. One day he was uncharacteristically late for a committee meeting of mine at the old Society offices on Allyn Street in Hartford. I remember the day well because a crew was cutting up our street with a huge circular pavement saw to repair the drainage system, and they used a thin, muddy brown liquid to keep the blade cool. Half of the street appeared awash in a milkchocolate river.

About 10 minutes into the meeting, an associate called me to the phone.

"Mark," came Ed's always-even voice out of the receiver. "I've fallen in the mud from the construction on Allyn Street and I'm down on the curb. Would you mind coming down to stay with me until my daughter comes to get me?"

I ran down and there sat Ed in the parking lot attendant's chair, his natty khaki summer suit soaked by the wet brown goo. As it turned out, Ed had suffered multiple injuries, including a broken leg. Yet he remained stoic ... actually smiling though the pain. That day, I met Ed's daughter Noelle for the first time as she arrived to take him for medical attention. Many years later Noelle would assume the CTCPA presidency, no doubt thrilling her proud father.

Ed wanted to know you as a human being as well as a business associate. He knew all about my family at his urging, not mine. He took great delight in signing his emails as "#364" - his CTCPA membership number, such was his pride in the profession. And he attended committee meetings even as his health slowly failed, ultimately arriving in a wheelchair accompanied by a caregiver companion.

The CPA profession, as professions go, is relatively young, about 120 years old. To me, Ed was one of many certified public accountants who forged the prestige and status of the CPA profession, leading the profession by example from 1947 until the day we lost him.

Today's newly certified public accountants receive more than a certificate, they assume the mantle of independence, integrity, character, and trust that their predecessors - the Ed Taddeis of Connecticut - put firmly in place during their tenure.
