Advocacy Update

Note: This information was accurate as of press time. Things change quickly during the legislative session. Check our Advocacy Updates for the latest.

Top Issues for Connecticut CPAs in the 2024 Legislative Short Session

Our advocacy efforts have ramped up significantly this year as we pursue various initiatives that our membership has specifically requested. This year's short session adjourns on May 8, so things will move very quickly.

Advocating in Support of CPA License Fee Reduction

Senate Bill 135: An Act Establishing a Maximum Charge for Certain Occupational Licenses, Certifications, Permits and Registrations could significantly reduce CPA licensure fees in our state. The CTCPA has advocated to reduce these fees for many, many years. The proposed bill seeks to cap initial and renewal licensure fees for CPAs and other professionals at just \$100!

While this reduction would greatly benefit our members and other licensed professionals in our state, it also carries a significant fiscal note, prompting extensive discussion and debate among legislators on how to offset the potential revenue loss to the state.

In support of this measure, we urged members to submit testimony advocating for Senate Bill 135 as well as contact their individual legislators using sample messages we provided through our VoterVoice action software. I also testified orally in support of the measure, highlighting the fact that Connecticut CPAs pay substantially higher license fees than any other CPAs in the country, placing an undue burden on our members.

We will continue to fight hard in support of this measure as the session moves on and keep you informed of any new developments.

State Tax Committee Requests

The State Tax Committee has raised proposals regarding DRS audit appeals, interest rate, and allocation of tax payments. At press time, changes regarding audit appeals are expected to be heard by the Finance Committee. We appreciate the Finance chairs agreeing to hold a public hearing on such a substantial measure during the short session. Unfortunately, they believe the interest rate and allocation of tax payments need more time, and that will not be heard this year. Still, we will continue to educate legislators on the measures so they can be brought back next year.

We have continued to build a strong and effective relationship with the Department of Revenue Services (DRS). DRS staff have been very responsive in helping bring about needed services we have advocated for including a taxpayer hotline and other administrative support for taxpayers and tax preparers. We look forward to continued collaboration and progress going forward.

Governmental Accounting and Auditing Committee Request

At press time, Senate Bill 363: *An Act Concerning Assorted Revisions To The Education Statutes* incorporated the Governmental Accounting and Auditing Committee's request to change the Connecticut State Department of Education (SDE) deadline for audits from December 31 to January 31. We will keep you apprised of any developments via electronic communications.

Not-for-Profit Organizations Committee Request

At press time, House Bill 5275: *An Act Concerning Audits of Certain Nonstate Entities Receiving State Financial Assistance* included a proposal to raise the single audit threshold from \$300,000 to \$500,000. While we support this, we also continue to advocate in support of raising the threshold from \$300,000 to \$750,000 to align with the federal threshold.

While these modifications could also be accomplished through a slower regulatory change, a legislative change would fast-track the process. We have been apprised that, while we may not be able to fully match the federal standards, there is a good chance we will get the Connecticut numbers adjusted this session.

NASBA Professional Licensure Task Force Issues Exposure Concept on Equivalent Licensure Model

This spring, the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA) Professional Licensure Task Force issued an Exposure Concept on the Equivalent Licensure Model.

This proposed structured experiential learning program, which both the CTCPA and the Connecticut State Board of Accountancy support, would provide for education, documented experience, and other elements that would provide an equivalent path to licensure without the need to have a fifth year to complete a 150-hour education program.

The CTCPA advocates for simplifying the CPA qualification process and reverting to the original 120-hour requirement, but with an additional year of experience.

We do recognize the critical importance of mobility, though, so we recommend that NASBA examines language that would enable states to initiate the passage of this measure but refrain from enacting it until a certain percentage of states have done so.

Responses to the exposure concept closed on March 31. We will keep you apprised of the issue as it progresses.

Read CTCPA's Response to the Exposure Concept

The Connecticut Society of Certified Public Accountants (CTCPA) supports NASBA's exploration of alternative pathways to CPA certification. We strongly urge you to keep the CPA qualification process straightforward as the profession evolves.

One alternative pathway CTCPA strongly recommends is restoring the original 120-hour requirement, complemented by an additional experiential year that does not include additional cost for CPA candidates.

On-the-job experience is an invaluable component of professional development, often more valuable than additional years of classroom education. Numerous studies have highlighted the profound impact of practical experience in equipping new professionals with the skills and knowledge needed to excel in their chosen fields.

Connecticut CPAs feel strongly that the value of one year of on-the-job experience surpasses the additional year (30 credits) of college coursework. Job candidates who participate in internships during their undergraduate studies experience higher employment rates and earn higher starting salaries. Still, the value of on-the-job learning does not end with college. The importance of onthe-job experience in bridging the gap between academic learning and realworld application is critical in fostering excellent proficiency and readiness for professional success.

Please keep the CPA qualification process valuable and simple. Restore the 120-hour requirement, with an additional experiential year added to the current two-year requirement.

We also recommend, recognizing the importance of mobility, that NASBA examines language enabling states to initiate the passage of this measure but refrain from enacting it until a certain percentage of states have done so. This approach would ensure a coordinated effort across states, facilitating smoother implementation and maximizing the benefits of mobility for CPA licensure. This is a common practice with environmental legislation.

Removing Barriers to CPA Licensure

We recently completed a survey of our members to determine some of our most valuable member benefits, and to learn about professional pain points and how we can help. It's no surprise that pipeline and staffing issues rated as a top concern for a

large portion of our membership.

In addition to many of the pipeline initiatives we have been conducting as an organization to reach Connecticut high school and college students – many of which are highlighted in the following report – there has been extensive discussion on this topic at the national level.

The new CPA Exam that launched in January was a major component of the American Institute of CPAs (AICPA) and National Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA) CPA Evolution project. The new exam is designed to be more modern and flexible and to better prepare new CPAs for the real-world environment they will face. With that aspect of reinventing the CPA pipeline well underway, it's time to move forward with addressing additional barriers to the profession.

These barriers include obtaining the additional credits beyond a bachelor's degree to meet the 150-hour requirement for licensing, costs associated with exam review courses, and exam fees.

At the forefront now is the 150-hour requirement. NASBA's Professional Licensure Task Force issued an exposure concept this winter to gauge interest in exploring equivalent paths to licensure that would not require a fifth year to complete the 150-hour requirement.

CTCPA leadership responded with a letter strongly supporting this concept, provided that it does not threaten the mobility of Connecticut CPAs to practice in other states.

It is imperative to focus on these efforts as students, especially those with financial constraints, are opting out of the CPA career path for alternative and often less costly options.

I encourage us all to think creatively about additional ways to address roadblocks that are preventing talented and qualified individuals from completing the CPA certification process. It is vital to our state's economic fabric that we to attract enough new CPAs to replace retirees, serve our clients and organizations, and protect the public interest.

As an executive-in-residence and member of the accounting faculty at Fordham University, I am part of its efforts to prepare students for changes to CPA licensing through the CPA Evolution initiative. The design of the new CPA Exam allows candidates to demonstrate competence in the profession's complexities and real-world skills they will need to succeed in the current environment, with a strong focus on technology.

Committees Covering Emerging and Established Specializations

At Fordham, I am responsible for Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) literacy, and I am happy to see the advances the profession has made in this emerging field. To demonstrate the society's commitment to this exciting area, I traveled to New Hampshire last summer to speak about ESG implications for businesses, investors, and the nonprofit sector. Another emerging area is cannabis. Our Cannabis Committee is going strong, meeting regularly to share ideas and recent developments and holding a successful conference in the spring.

These committees join almost two dozen specialized groups the CTCPA offers as part of your membership – covering everything from tax, audit, and not-for-profits to financial institutions, employee benefit plans, and more. I urge you to consider committee membership as an invaluable member benefit.

High School Classroom Visits

As part of a nationwide initiative, we joined forces with the American Institute of CPAs (AICPA) and other state CPA associations for the Accounting Opportunities Experience. Our goal was to get members into as many classrooms as possible to share their stories about their career paths and to inspire tomorrow's CPAs.

Accounting Is My Major (AIM) High School Programs at Connecticut Colleges

Our popular Accounting Is My Major (AIM) programs bring high school students from across the state to Connecticut colleges and universities. This fall, participants heard from college faculty and students as well as those working in the profession at Southern Connecticut State University, the University of Connecticut, and the University of Hartford.

Promoting the CPA at College Career Fairs CTCPA staff heads to college career fairs around the state, providing students with materials including CTCPA's Guide to Becoming a CPA in Connecticut and career information from our partnership with the AICPA. **66%** of accounting majors decided to major in accounting before they began college, according to recent Center for Audit Quality research. Reaching students earlier in their academic journey is critical.

CPA Exam Review Course Discounts and Personalized Help on the Path to CPA

We support our student members with discounts on CPA Exam review courses, help making sure they've fulfilled the requirements, and one-on-one guidance to help navigate the certification process.

Scholarships for Accounting Majors

The CTCPA Accounting Scholarship Foundation (ASF) provides scholarships to Connecticut high school and college students, encouraging a strong pipeline for years to come. This year, trustees awarded more than \$50,000 in scholarships to help aspiring CPAs.

Advocacy

Stay in-the-know on important legislative and regulatory developments.

Members rely on us to keep on top of breaking news and developments at the State Capitol and beyond. Not only do we work hard to defend the profession and Connecticut organizations against harmful legislation, we also connect members with officials and pursue a number of legislative and regulatory initiatives each year.

Our advocacy efforts help build relationships so legislators respect and rely on us to offer feedback on new tax and economic proposals, ensuring they are crafted in the most effective way to achieve their intended goals.

Connecting with DRS and Other Officials

Members had the opportunity to connect one-onone with DRS representatives at DRS liaison meetings in Hartford and Fairfield counties. Our conferences, committee meetings, and other events also featured representatives from the IRS, FASB, GASB, FBI, U.S. DOL, and taxation divisions from several states in the region.

State Board of Accountancy Developments

Recent State Board of Accountancy (SBOA) meetings have focused on important policy issues for the profession, including removing barriers to licensure and addressing concerns in order to move the profession forward. CTCPA representatives attend all SBOA meetings so we can keep you informed on important developments affecting the profession.

Department of Consumer Protection Help The Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection (DCP) oversees CPA licensing and regulation, firm permits, peer review, and more. We work closely with the DCP and our members to help clarify requirements and navigate issues that arise. 51% of members who participated in a recent VoterVoice grassroots campaign were first-time participants. Our action alerts allow to you edit a short pre-written message and send it to your legislators with one click on our website.

Advocacy for Audit Issues

We advocate on behalf of our members working in financial reporting and auditing by working directly with agencies including the State Department of Education and Office of Policy and Management to ensure filing deadlines are appropriate. We also supported members working with not-for-profits by successfully advocating to raise the not-for-profit audit threshold and are pursuing additional single audit threshold changes this session.

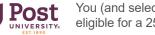
